The Auctioneers Association of Alberta held its 85th Annual Convention at the Premier Best Western Hotel in Calgary on January 3rd, February 1st and 2nd, 2019. There were approximately 140 people in attendance.

Dale Menzak of Vegreville was re-elected President. Wade Michener from Calgary is Vice President. John Arnold, Lethbridge is our Past President.

There was four positions open for directors. Re-elected for three years were: Dale Menzak; Jason Philp, Didsbury; and Rod Burnett, West Kelowna. Newly elected was Michael Jennings, Condor. Other directors are Joe Perlich, Lethbridge; Andrew Reeleder, Bentley; Tracy Pollard, Edmonton; Mickey Spencer, Fort Saskatchewan; Darrell Domes, Caglary; Justin Mayer, Drayton Valley and Wade Michener, Calgary. Bill Henke is Liaison for BC auctioneers. Lorraie Klepper is Secretary-treasurer.

Committee Reports

AMVIC

As of October the new government appointed chair person is Mrs. Phillis Bohachyk. There are still three vacant public board member positions on the Baord of Directors and recruitment for those positions continues to move through the government approval process.

It has been, and continues to be, a challenge for AMVIC and the Board to learn how to be a Government Agency. There has been discussion around the Board table regarding awareness of the Elections Act, specifically pertaining to restrictions, limitations, communication and stakeholder engagement. The government will share their guidelines with AMVIC when they finalize their policies on these issues.

Financially, AMVIC is sound and this years

projected budget has a very small surplus due to some belt tightening anc utback in expenditures. AMVIC continues to look to the Minister to allow an increae in fees in order to provide the level of service that the Government has instructed us to do based on the ciff report. At this point in time, no increase in fees or levies have been approved by the Minister. In the future, it will be difficult to maintain a balanced budget without these increases.

The AMVIC Compensation Fund paid out over \$400,000 in claims in 2019 to Alberta consumers.

On a positive note, the Auction industry made up less than 1 percent of all compaints that were registered with AMVIC.
